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POKEY CHATMAN HEAD COACH/GENERAL MANAGER

Pokey Chatman returns for her second season as the Head Coach and General Manager of the Chicago Sky. In her first season with the club, Chatman led a young Sky squad to a 14-20 record with a winning record at home for only the second time in the organization's history. Through sheer determination, she rallied the team to beat several of the most talented teams in the league.

Chatman came to the Sky after coaching professional women's basketball in Russia as well as serving 15 years on the coaching staff at Louisiana State University (LSU), her alma mater. She served two seasons as an assistant coach for the Russian Spartak Moscow Region before being promoted to head coach in 2010. That year, Chatman led the team to a perfect 16-0 record in the Euroleague, the most competitive European basketball league, and also claimed the esteemed 2010 Euroleague Championship. Chatman also coached the Slovakian national women's basketball team from 2008-2010. In 2009 she took the traditionally unsuccessful Slovakian squad to the EuroBasket in Riga, where they narrowly missed a spot in the FIBA World Championship.

Chatman was named head coach of the LSU Lady Tigers in the 2003-2004 season, when Sue Gunter was



forced to take medical leave mid-season. Chatman went a remarkable 47-3 in her first 50 games as head coach, the second best starting record in women's college basketball history. As head coach, she took the Tigers to three consecutive finishes in the Final Four. For her work in her first full season as a head coach, she was named the U.S. Basketball Writers Association National Coach of the Year, Women's Basketball Coaches Association National Coach of the Year, Naismith National Coach of the Year and the Victor Award Female Coach of the Year. Chatman earned a coaching record of 90-14 with the Lady Tigers in three seasons as head coach and 15 seasons overall.

She has earned two gold medals with USA basketball, first as a player for the Junior National Team in 1987, and then as an assistant coach of the World University team in 2005. As an LSU point guard from 1987-1991, Chatman led the Lady Tigers to their first ever SEC Tournament title in 1991, and earned recognition as the tournament's Most Valuable Player. In her playing career at LSU, she was named All-SEC three times, named Kodak All-American in 1991, and set 20 school records. Chatman earned her Bachelor's Degree from LSU in December of 1991. She is originally from Ama, Louisiana.



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JEFF HOUSE **ASSISTANT COACH**

In his second season with the Sky, Jeff House brings over 25 years of basketball coaching experience at the NBA, WNBA, college and high school levels to the Chicago Sky bench.

House's coaching career began while he was still in college, getting his start in 1985 under former Houston Rockets Head Coach Jeff Van Gundy at McQuaid Jesuit High School in Rochester, NY. Since then, he's had the opportunity to work with a number of top coaches, later coaching at UMass Lowell under current Orlando Magic Head Coach Stan Van Gundy, and with Bob Wenzel at Rutgers University. House played college basketball while he attended Nazareth College in Rochester, NY before suffering a career-ending injury.

House received his bachelor's degree from Nazareth in 1987 in art education. House and his wife Ann Leonard-House, who is the former Head Women's Volleyball Coach at UMass-Lowell and Rutgers, reside in Virginia in the off-season with their two children.



CHRISTIE SIDES **ASSISTANT COACH**

Christie Sides enters her second season as a Sky assistant coach after eight years of coaching experience at the college, international and professional levels.

Since 2008, Sides has been an assistant on Spartak Moscow Region in Russia, where she helped Head Coach Pokey Chatman lead Spartak to consecutive FIBA EuroLeague Championships in 2008 and 2009. Sides also served as an assistant coach for the Slovakian Women's National Team helping them qualify for the European Championships in 2009, 2010 and 2011.

Sides began her coaching career as the head junior varsity coach and assistant varsity coach at Ruston (La.) High School where she served under Ricky Durrett. Sides played college basketball at Ole Miss for Hall of Fame coach Van Chancellor and at Louisiana Tech for fellow Hall of Fame coach Leon Barmore. In high school, Sides led Central Private High School to the state championship her senior season.

Sides is a native of Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

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ANN CROSBY **DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL** **OPERATIONS & STRENGTH AND** **CONDITIONING COACH**

Ann Crosby is in her sixth season with the Sky. She has 15 years of experience as an independent strength and conditioning consultant for professional athletes. She served as the head strength and conditioning coach for all 18 UIC athletic teams for three years. Prior to UIC, she served as a strength and conditioning coach for Georgia Tech and Northwestern University. Crosby was the first full-time strength and conditioning coach for the Women's United Soccer Association after serving as the head of athlete performance for the Carolina Courage WUSA team. Crosby also consulted for the Chicago Red Stars women's soccer team.

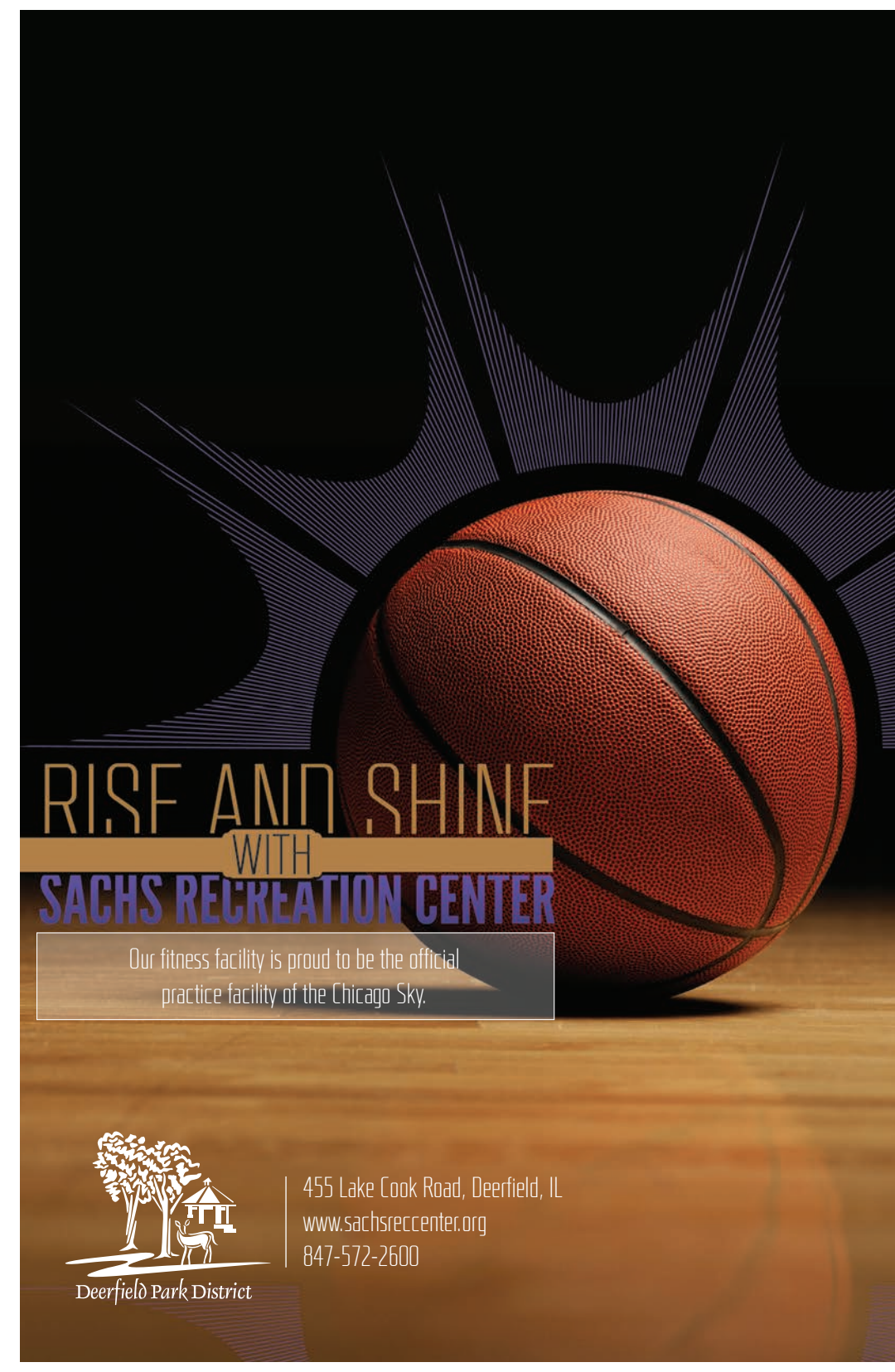


LYNETTE CARLSON **HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER**

Lynette is a licensed athletic trainer who works with the Chicago Sky courtesy of our partners at ATI Physical Therapy. Her responsibilities cover all aspects of medical care and rehabilitation for the team. Her main goals for the Sky are injury prevention, rehabilitation and the treatment of movement dysfunctions. She bridges the gap between rehabilitation and performance by enhancing the physical health and functional abilities of the athletes. She's been certified for 12 years and begins her first season in the WNBA.

She received a bachelor of science in physical education specializing in athletic training from Southern Illinois University prior to receiving a master's degree in athletic training from the University of Tennessee in Chattanooga. Lynette is currently pursuing her doctorate in health science at Midwestern University.

She is a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association and is certified in Active Release Techniques. Carlson is a native of Woodhull, Illinois, but now makes her home in Chicago.

Cash came to Chicago in a January 2 trade that brought the three-time WNBA champion to the Sky along with Le'coe Willingham. Chicago is Cash's third team as she competes in her 11th season in the league. As a forward with the Seattle Storm in 2011, Cash played and started in all 34 games, averaging 13.3 points, a career-best 6.9 rebounds, and 2.4 assists per game. She was selected as a starter in her fourth All-Star game, where she scored 21 points, grabbed 12 rebounds, and was named All-Star MVP. Her best game of the season came on July 1 at Connecticut as she posted 25 points and nine rebounds while connecting on 12 of 12 free throws. Cash surpassed the 4,000-point mark in her career in a game at San Antonio on September 3, becoming just the 17th player in WNBA history to reach 4,000 points. The 6-foot-1 forward led the Detroit Shock to two WNBA titles (2003, 2006) and the Seattle Storm to the franchise's second championship (2010). She was a member of the gold medal-winning U.S. women's basketball team in the 2012 and 2004 Olympics, and is one of seven women to win an NCAA Championship, a WNBA Championship and an Olympic gold medal. She represented Team USA in the London 2012 Olympics this summer. Cash was drafted by Detroit with the second overall pick in the 2002 WNBA Draft. In four years at the University of Connecticut, Cash led the team to two national championships in 2000 and 2002. She was named the 2002 Final Four Most Outstanding Player after leading the team to a 39-0 record. Cash was raised by her mother, Cynthia, and has two brothers and a sister. In 2005, she launched Cash for Kids, a foundation that seeks to raise money for children in need. She remains heavily involved in charity work.

In 2011, Fowles enjoyed another banner year, improving on her record-breaking 2010 season across the board. The 6-foot-6 forward played and started in all 34 games and averaged a double-double of 20.0 points and 10.2 rebounds, becoming only the second player in WNBA history to average 20 points and 10 rebounds in a season. She finished as the league leader in blocks per game (2.0) and field goal percentage (.591), while placing second in rebounds and third in scoring. Fowles broke 16 Sky records, including points in a season (680), consecutive games scoring 20 plus points (seven) and blocks in a game (eight). She was named the 2011 WNBA Defensive Player of the Year in addition to earning a spot on the Eastern Conference All-Star team. Fowles recorded a Sky-record 22 double-doubles in the season, including a WNBA-record eight in a row. On Sept. 11, against Seattle, she recorded her 1,000th rebound as she became the Sky's all-time rebound leader in just her fourth season. In 2008 Fowles was selected to the WNBA All-Rookie team and won a gold medal as part of the 2008 and 2010 U.S. women's basketball team. She won her second gold medal as part of Team USA

at the 2012 Olympics in London. Fowles led the Louisiana State University Tigers to four Final Four appearances and was the 2008 SEC Player of the Year. She was the first high school player to ever dunk in a game. Fowles is the daughter of Arittio Fowles and has three brothers and one sister. She enjoys drawing and sewing and can play the saxophone.



#7 SHAY MURPHY

Murphy signed a seven-day contract with the Sky on July 25, 2011, and quickly proved herself worthy to sign on for the remainder of the season. In a reserve role, Murphy averaged 9.8 points and 4.8 rebounds per game over 10 games before injuring her thumb and missing the Sky's final seven games. The 5-foot-11 guard scored in double digits four times, including a career-high 21 points against the Indiana Fever on Aug. 7. The five-year veteran has played for five teams, including Minnesota, Washington, Detroit, Indiana and Chicago. She was drafted in the second round (15th overall) of the 2007 WNBA Draft by Minnesota. Murphy played four years at the University of Southern California, finishing as the school's all-time leader in 3-point field goals (181). She also finished in the top 10 in points (1,492), rebounds (722) and steals (234). She graduated with a degree in sociology. Murphy was raised by her mother, Pauletta, and has one brother. During the 2011-12 offseason, Murphy played for Ros Casares in Spain, helping the club win the Euroleague Championship in her first year.

In 2011, Penicheiro was named as one of the exclusive Top-15 WNBA Players of All-Time. The 14-year veteran is the league's record-holder in assists (2,560), nearly 800 more than second-place Sue Bird. She is second all-time in steals (756) behind Tamika Catchings (775) and in total games played (435). Penicheiro joined the Chicago Sky as a free agent in 2012. The Portugal native started 23 of 34 games last season for the Los Angeles Sparks and led the team with 4.8 assists per game. She also averaged 6.0 points and 2.8 rebounds. Penicheiro scored 23 points on Aug. 9 against Tulsa and dished out a WNBA season-high 11 assists against Atlanta on July 28. As point guard for the Sacramento Monarchs, Penicheiro was selected to the All-Star game in four straight years from 1999-2002. She led the Monarchs to the franchise's only WNBA title in 2005. Penicheiro enjoyed a successful college career at Old Dominion University, leading the Lady Monarchs to the 1997 NCAA Championship game. She finished as the school's all-time steals leader (591) and ranked second in total assists (939). As a senior, Penicheiro earned the Wade Trophy as the nation's top player and was subsequently taken with the No. 2 overall pick by Sacramento in the 1998 WNBA Draft. Her father, Joao, is a former basketball player who now coaches her brother, Paulo, who plays professionally in Portugal.

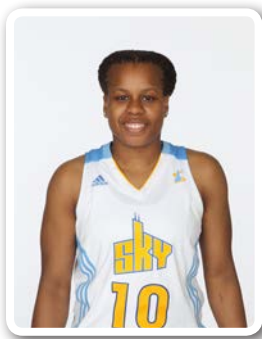

Chicago acquired Petrovic from San Antonio on March 14 in exchange for a 2013 second round pick. Petrovic played for four years at Spartak Moscow Region under Sky coach Pokey Chatman. While playing in Russia this past season, the 6-foot-1 forward averaged 9.0 points, 5.1 rebounds and 1.3 assists per game. The sharpshooter hit 46.9 percent from beyond the arc, good for third best in Euroleague. While representing Serbia in the U20 European Championships, Petrovic was the tournament's third leading scorer at 20.0 points per game and third-best rebounder at 9.4 rebounds per contest. Other European highlights include being named the FIBA Europe Young Player of the Year and winning a bronze medal during the U19 World Championships, where she averaged 12.3 points and 9.3 rebounds per game. She also led her national team to a gold medal in the U18 European Championships in 2007, averaging a double-double of 12.3 points and 10.0 rebounds per game. Petrovic was born in Belgrade, Serbia.



#10 EPIHANNY PRINCE

Prince played in all 34 games of the 2011 season, starting 27 of those contests. The 5-foot-9 combo guard is quickly rising up the ranks in Chicago, where she was the second-leading scorer for the team (13.6 points per game) in just her second year in the WNBA. Prince was also second on the team in assists (3.0). She broke the single-season record for most steals (79) by a Sky player and finished second in the league with 2.32 steals per game. Prince was selected to her first All-Star team, where she scored eight points in 20 minutes of action. Her best game as a pro came against the Connecticut Sun on July 23 as she scored 25 points and dished out six assists in 37 minutes. She was the fourth overall pick in the 2010 WNBA Draft. Prince attended Rutgers University, where she finished ninth in scoring (1,552) and sixth in steals (260). She left Rutgers after her junior year to play overseas. Prince is the daughter of Kathy and Jerry Prince and is originally from Brooklyn, New York. While playing for Murry Bergtraum High School in 2006, she set the record for most points in a high school girls' basketball game with 113, breaking the mark set by Hall of Famer Cheryl Miller.

Riley joins the Chicago Sky for the 2012 season after playing the last five seasons in San Antonio. As a member of the Silver Stars, Riley started all 34 regular season games in 2011 and averaged 5.6 points, 3.8 rebounds and 1.2 assists per game. Following the season, she was named co-winner of the Kim Perrot Sportsmanship Award. Riley won two WNBA championships with the Detroit Shock in 2003 and 2006 and was named the 2003 WNBA Finals MVP. She was also a member of the gold medal-winning U.S. Olympic team in 2004, becoming one of only seven players to win an NCAA Championship, a WNBA Championship, and an Olympic gold medal. Riley was named to the Eastern Conference All-Star team in 2005. After 11 years in the league, Riley is currently No. 6 all-time in the WNBA in blocks with 481. She was drafted with the fifth overall pick by Miami in the 2001 WNBA Draft. Riley enjoyed a successful four-year career at the University of Notre Dame, finishing as the school's all-time leader in blocks (370) and field goal percentage (.632). In her senior year, she led the Fighting Irish to their first national championship and earned multiple player of the year awards, including the Naismith Award. In the 2011-12 offseason, Riley played for Liaoning Baocheng of the Women's Chinese Basketball Association in China. Riley is the daughter of Sharon Riley, and has one older sister, Rachel Cattin, and one younger brother, Jacob Riley. She graduated from Notre Dame in May, 2001, with degrees in psychology and sociology.



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#30 CAROLYN SWORDS

Swords enters her second season with the Chicago Sky. After being selected with the 15th overall pick in the 2011 WNBA Draft, she averaged 2.7 points and 1.8 rebounds per game as a rookie. Swords played in 29 of the team's 34 games and started in four. The most outstanding game of her career came on Sept. 8 at Minnesota where she scored nine points, reeled in eight rebounds, tallied four assists and recorded three blocks. The Boston College alum notched her first career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds in a 2012 preseason game over the New York Liberty. During the 2011-12 offseason, Swords spent time playing with Joventut Mariana in Spain and Istanbul Universitesi in Turkey. Swords has two siblings, John and Marybeth. They reside with their Aunt Susan Halliday and cousins Rob and Russ, who both played lacrosse at Bowdoin College. She graduated from Boston College with a degree in communications.

#22 COURTNEY VANDERSLOOT

Selected with the third overall pick in the 2011 WNBA Draft, Vandersloot enters her second season with the Chicago Sky. The 5-foot-8 guard appeared in all 34 games last season, starting 26 of them. In 22.9 minutes per game, Vandersloot averaged 6.5 points, 2.0 rebounds and 3.7 assists per game. The Gonzaga alum set a Sky single season record with 127 assists in 2011. Vandersloot's outstanding play helped her get selected to the 2011 WNBA All-Star Game as an Eastern Conference reserve. She was also named to the WNBA All-Rookie Team. Vandersloot scored a career-high 18 points against Connecticut on June 10 and dished a career-high 10 assists less than two weeks later, also against Connecticut. The daughter of Bill and Jan Vandersloot, Courtney is a native of Kent, Washington, and graduated from Kentwood High School. She is the leading scorer as a senior in the state of Washington. She also spent time training with former Utah Jazz star and NBA Hall-of-Famer John Stockton, a fellow Washington native and Gonzaga alum.

Willingham played in all 34 games for the Seattle Storm in 2011, starting in eight contests. The eight-year veteran averaged 6.4 points and 4.2 rebounds and reached double figures in scoring four times. In 2010, Willingham helped Seattle win its second WNBA title as she averaged 5.5 points and 4.4 rebounds off the bench. The previous year, she started all 34 games for the 2009 WNBA champions Phoenix Mercury and averaged 10.0 points and 4.2 boards per game. Willingham joined the WNBA as a free agent in 2004 with the Connecticut Sun, where she played four years. The 6-foot forward attended the University of Auburn, where she finished as the seventh all-time scorer (1,475) and the sixth all-time rebounder (927). Willingham also finished top 10 in starts, field goals made, free throws made and free throws attempted. She is the daughter of Louis Willingham and Louise Shivers. She has three brothers and a son named Derrick.

Young enters her third full season with the Chicago Sky in 2012. She started 19 of 33 games during the 2011 season and averaged 7.9 points, 3.8 rebounds and 1.3 assists in a career-high 24 minutes per game. Young also made a career-high 42.5 percent of her field goals last season and shot 72.4 percent from the free throw line. Young was selected eighth overall by the Atlanta Dream in the 2008 WNBA Draft and appeared in 33 games for the Dream that season, including 15 starts. She averaged 7.3 points, 4.2 rebounds and 1.2 assists per game. Young holds the Colonial Athletic Association and James Madison University career scoring record with 2,121 points. She is second in career rebounds at JMU with 1,127 and is only the second player in school history to record more than 1,000 rebounds. Young received the 2007-08 CAA Player of the Year Award and an Associated Press All-America honorable mention as a senior. She is the daughter of Greg Young and Lynda Nichols-Brown and John Brown. Young also has a brother, A.J., and two sisters, Nikia and Valerie. She enjoys watching movies and shopping in her free time.

WNBA Fit

WNBA Fit encourages girls and women of all ages to learn more about their bodies and the importance of physical fitness through programs related to health, fitness, nutrition and self-esteem. Programming inspires girls and women to get started on "being fit" through small changes in their daily routine. The content of the program is communicated and delivered through a 'Team' of Spokespeople and National and Local Events. 2012 programming includes Sky players, coaches and staff running instructional basketball clinics throughout the year. The Chicago Sky Cares Fitness Festival took place prior to the July 13th game.

The Fitness Festival is designed to show youth different ways to get active. The Sky Cares Foundation works with local girl-serving organizations (Girls in the Game, Girls on the Run, GoGirlGo Chicago, Step Up Women's Network, Chicago Park District and the Mayor's Fitness Council as well as Chicago Public Schools) to identify youth from low income areas of Chicago and welcome them into an inspiring community of positive role-model volunteers. During the Fitness Festival various organizations showed the kids how to get moving whether it's playing a sport, dancing or jumping double-dutch. At each station, the kids watched and participated in demonstrations and interacted with instructors, with the goal of helping



them make a fitness plan. Following an afternoon at the Fitness Festival, the kids enjoyed a Chicago Sky game, which affords an unforgettable opportunity for these kids to witness first hand the power and poise of professional female athletes. It also provides a motivating message of what can be accomplished through dedication, determination and discipline.

WNBA Cares Week of Service

On May 11th the Chicago Sky, its Foundation – Sky Cares, and the Chicago Sky Legacy Partners joined Samaritan's Feet to provide one thousand new shoes for children in need in Chicago's Austin community. Dedicated to providing children in need with new athletic shoes and socks, Samaritan's Feet strives to instill both shoe recipients and volunteers with a life changing message of hope and respect for all people.

Anti-Bullying

On June 13th the Sky hosted a pre-game anti-bullying workshop with the Anti-Defamation League. The workshop focused on how to become an ally when it comes to all forms of bullying.

As part of the day's festivities, the Sky players will wear pink uniforms, and the Sky encourages all fans to wear pink in an effort to "pink out" the arena. At the game, breast cancer survivors will be honored guests, and a silent auction will take place where fans will have a chance to bid on the pink game jerseys, numerous sports experiences and autographed memorabilia from teams and athletes from the Chicagoland area as well as the WNBA.



Sky Cares Foundation

The Chicago Sky Cares Foundation's mission is to enrich the lives of our community's youth and families by demonstrating the positive impact a professional women's basketball team can make in the community by inspiring greatness through strong, athletic and educated roles models. 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SKY GUY Born and raised in Chicago, Sky Guy is the team's biggest fan. 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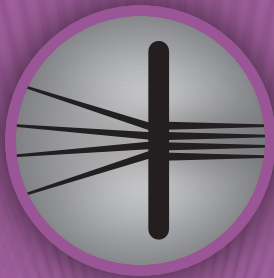
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
